


# Work experience – First steps with the company Heinrich Schmid

4.1. Work experience

Techniques in the painting trade

It's time to try something out for yourself. To do this, you'll need some materials. Please organize the following:


- medium cardboard box
- small and large paint brushes
- small can of primer paint white or light gray
- small paint cans with at least 3 colors (wall paint)
- very small paint roller with scraper grid
- paint spray can and mouth/nose guard
- 3 or 4 plastic containers or small buckets in which to mix paint
- tarpaulin to lay underneath and some old newspapers
- thin roll of masking tape
- sponge
- A4 piece of thick plastic foil (e.g. empty plastic folder)
- scissors, waterproof pen
- small water bucket and wiping cloth (if paints are smudge-proof, also a small bottle of thinner as a cleaning agent)

Oh my, it's expensive all together? Ask your neighbors or relatives if anyone has any materials, tools or paint left in the basement from the last painting job. Look online at classified ads to see if anyone is giving any of it away. You can also ask at the company Heinrich Schmid. You can get one or the other also there.

Everything there? Do you have work clothes on that can get dirty? Now you can start.

## **Step 1: Prepare the workplace**

Find a place where you can work undisturbed for a while. Spread out the tarpaulin and cover it with newspaper. Then unfold the cardboard so that it looks like this:

## Step 2: Use masking tape

Take your roll of masking tape in your hand and unroll a piece. Try pulling on it. Does the tape tear quickly? How many pounds can the tape withstand before it breaks? Think about how you can find out and carry out the experiment. Tip: In the kitchen you will surely find some packaged food with measurements...



Now tape a total of 6 surfaces on your cardboard.

You can also try tearing off the edges straight, as shown in the tips and tricks. If you don't have a spatula, you can try using a ruler. Caution: Press the ruler on very firmly.



It might look something like this when you're done.



#### Step 3: Primer

To prevent the cardboard from becoming soggy and falling apart when you paint it, it needs a primer. This can be easily applied with a brush or roller. You can paint the entire surface with a brush or apply the primer with a roller. A thin layer is sufficient. Let it dry. Then apply a second thin layer. When this is also dry, you can continue.

In film 2 (Part: Tipps and tricks) you will find many good tips. Among other things, it explains how to handle a roller well. Have another look.

# **Step 4: Try out techniques**

- 1. Paint the surface with a brush
- 2. Paint surface with a roller
- 3. Dab paint on an area with a sponge
- 4. Use a stencil to apply a pattern or design element to a surface
- 5. Spray a surface with paint
- 6. Color a surface with a brush and your own ideas (pattern or picture)

Do each of these techniques in turn, using a different one on each surface of your cardboard box. You can choose the order. Document your work with some photos. Try to use different colors and mix them as well.

With techniques 4 and 5 there is a lot more to consider than with the other options. Therefore here are some hints:

# Working with stencils

You can cut a small stencil from a piece of plastic (empty stapler for example) or from a piece of cardboard. To do this, first draw your pattern. (On plastic, use a sharpie pen to trace.) After cutting, place the stencil on your pre-primed piece of cardboard and use a paintbrush to dab the pattern onto the surface. Be careful when removing the stencil. You must not slip, otherwise the exact image will smudge.

Ideally, you can use the stencil several times.

Of course, it is important that you only spray in the fresh air, on the balcony or in the cellar or under a canopy and that you wear a mask.

In any case, read the safety instructions on the can thoroughly.
